promote early education and its importance. It also helps us build strong relationships with the families."



Wednesday November 8, the AIGA Chefs Challenge brought together premier casino resort culinary masters to compete for the Best of Show and People's Choice Award at Harrah's Ak-Chin Casino Resort

for the night, lights hanging over the patio outside of Oak and fork lit up the evening, creating a great ambiance for the Chefs Challenge.

Once the sun disappeared

All stations were uniquely setup with excellent presentations of each dish.

When I first entered, I was greeted by a guest telling me I had to try Chef Laura Gonzalez Reyes dish. The line was long so I proceeded to try the other dishes while I waited. Each dish had its own flavors and traditional delicacies.

Chef Alex Rivera from Bucky's Casino served baked quail with barley, wild mushrooms, walnuts, spinach and sauteed baby carrots under an agave and fig glaze.

Casino Del Sol was represented by Chef David Salazar, the dish of choice was a red chili braised bison on a flat green chili enchilada with native tepary beans, cotija-crema espuma and crispy corn.

One guest I spoke with said they loved that this one had a slight spice.

Talking Stick Resort served prosciutto wrapped and stuffed wild boar tenderloin under the direction of Chef Agustin Flores Jr.

Harrah's Ak-Chin Casino Chef Colin Ribble's TOHONO was sous vide venison lion, prickly pear demi-glace, marinated and roasted pearl onions, sous vide butternut squash and sweet potatoes, tepary beans over frybread with corn garnish.

Chef Edward Harris at Hon-Dah Resort Casino prepared smoked Elk medallion with Apache corn bread.

Paradise Casino's Chef David Dobransky's dish of choice was sauteed three sisters' pinto beans, fresh corn on the cob and delicata squash.

from Gila River Resort & Casino prepared miso marinated black cod with hajikami shoga.

Chef Laura I. Gonzalez Reyes was named the Chef Challenge winner for both People's Choice and Best of Show.

The dish that had everyone talking was her mesquite slow braised short ribs with blue corn mais polenta and pickled cholla buds.

Chef Gonzalez has worked her way up from prep cook, line cook, catering cook, catering chef, business owner, executive chef and currently Nineteen 86 steakhouse chef at Desert Diamond Casino.

Chef Gonzalez also appeared on Food "Chopped" Network's and "Beat Bobby Flay" and now holds the title of AIGA 2023 Chef Challenge winner.

Relay for Life supports cancer survivors, patients and remembers those that have passed

The warmth of the sun on Saturday, November 4, 2023 brought a feeling of hope to the group gathered at the Relay for Life of Maricopa presented by Harrah's Ak-Chin at Copper Sky Regional Park.

next to the stage, stood a single, white tree that held the ribbons of cancer victims and survivors. Each color of the ribbons corresponded with the type of cancer the individual was fighting.

To the right side was a table, known as "The Empty Table", which had a single plate with lemon and salt symbolizing the bitter battle of those fighting cancer.

In the U.S. alone, over 18 million faced this difficult diagnosis in 2022 and cancer diagnosis are projected to reach 26 million by 2040 according to the National

Cancer Institute.

Relay for Life is an event that started in 1985 when Tacoma, physician in Washington alternated between walking and running around a track to raise money for the American Cancer Society. Dr. Klatt's goal was the draw attention to the needs of patients being treated for cancer with the hopes that

one day a cure would be discovered. Almost forty years later, survivors and supporters gather across the world to walk, run and share stories through the Cancer Society Global Relay for Life Partners program. In the United States, an estimated 4 million people participate in the event on an annual basis.

Sherry L. Girard, was the main force behind the search on Facebook. I reached out to her when a community-wide email was sent out about Winnie being located in Ak-Chin.

I asked if she would share Winnie's Wild Adventure story, so thankful for Sherry's story below.



7-month-old Chocolate Labradoodle, was all set for the next chapter in her life. New home and new doggie parents Curt and Babette Beaupre.

Curt and Babette had just purchased her from a Craigslist ad by someone who lived in Tempe. She seemed a little bit dirty to them so they decided to stop at one of the pet grooming facilities in Maricopa where they lived before taking her to their home. Winnie got all shampooed and groomed and even was given a pretty little ribbon from the groomer.

As they were leaving the groomers to head home the unthinkable happened. Winnie pulled out of her collar as they were loading her up and ran off. She now was loose in an unknown area and hadn't even had a chance to really bond with her new owners. Curt and Babette were devastated!

Winnie went into what is called "flight mode" and was not coming to anyone calling her.

It was not until 18 days later that she would finally be trapped. Her journey would turn out to be a long and wild one with many people helping along the way to try and contain her.

She started out on Smith-Enke Road and John Wayne

Parkway heading East. The next time she was seen...a day or so later...was over at the Maricopa Unified School District offices and into the nearby Senita Subdivision.

She then traveled down the

canal, along the Casa Grande highway, clear down and across the highway from Walmart close to the Santa Rosa neighborhood. She was hunkered down by a line of trees out in one of the fields there. The owners, Maricopa Animal Control Officer Luke Zacardi and I were trying to catch her there but she ran off

It was probably another day or so before we got another sighting and we would be shocked to learn she had traveled West, all the way to the Thunderbird Farms area out in Hidden Valley! At this point we called HARTT, professional trapping organization, and started working with one of their trappers, Carolyn Rodriguez-Barreras.

Winnie was now hiding out up on the side of one of the mountains there and was still extremely scared and skittish. Carolyn set a couple of traps there on the mountain but Winnie never came anywhere near them.

The search stayed at this Mountain area for a couple of days and steps were taken to bring in not only a drone to survey the area looking for her but also a small plane equipped with someone with special equipment for locating objects down below. Winnie was nowhere to be seen.



was a sighting Northeast of the mountain at one of the Palm tree farms so Carolyn moved the traps quickly to that area. Nothing...traps left overnight.

Now we are at day 18 and everything falls into place for the final day. Two sighting calls early morning over off Ralston and Farrell and heading towards the Ak-Chin Indian Community.

As Carolyn, Curt, Babette and I are gathering together to formulate a plan of what to do next we have two nice gentlemen from the Reservation pull up to chat.... Lieutenant David Villescaz from the (Ak-Chin) police department and Security

We explain what we were doing and they both eagerly jumped in to assist. They both head out to look and within 5 minutes Officer Villescaz calls Carolyn and says he sees Winnie! She has gone into the front of a building and is laying down in the shade looking like a stuffed animal she's so still.

When we get there, we quickly pull the trap out of Carolyn's truck and commence to set it up but she gets up and leaves. Now she's heading back out to the main road, Farrell. I go out to the main road and start throwing food at her to keep her in the area while Carolyn and Officer Villescaz load the trap back up.

Now of course we're on the main road going back and forth so Security Guard William Narcia pulls up and he and Officer Villescaz help with traffic.

After about 5 minutes or so of her wandering back and forth on the road and to trap she finally goes in! Winnie's Wild Adventures are now over! Well over 19 miles and 18 days later!

It took a village of people along the way to help but we never gave up on her! She is now at her new home and adjusting nicely!

But Winnie's story does not end here, as Winnie's story was recently shared on Fox10 news as well!

Winnie's parents are so thankful to everyone who reached out over those long stressful weeks to offer their support and advocate for Winnie's safe return. There were so many who stepped up to volunteer and help locate Winnie. Updates were being posted daily on FB and many searched far and wide for hours, hoping for a glimpse or siting of her.

great How see Communities of Maricopa and Ak-Chin rally together to ensure Winnie safely made it back to her new parents and her fur-ever home.


