Ak-Chin Preschool enjoys Valentine **Dance Party**





The fourth game was "Name that Song", where each participant received 1 point for every song title correctly guessed and 1 point if they could name the artist. Everyone was very


excited about this game, as they were already singing and guessing to the music even before the game started.

On Friday, February 2nd, American Indian middle and high school students had the opportunity to participate in Arizona State University RECHARGE (ASU) Conference.

The annual conference is hosted by ASU Office American of Indian Initiatives and Access ASU at the Tempe campus. The conference includes engaging activities and inspiring presentations on culture and identity, college readiness, financial aid, majors, and campus resources.

This year, Ak-Chin Education staff transported and chaperoned seven Ak-Chin high school students from Maricopa High School and out of district high schools to the conference. During this event, keynote speaker Charley Hogan, 16 and a junior in high school who starred in her first Netflix movie "Frybread Face and Me" shared her experience and journey in being a part of the movie.

Speakers included Dr. Quinton Boyce, professor at ASU and staff from Phoenix Indian Center both speaking on the importance of post-
