June 3, the Ak-Chin Human Resources held the 2024 Summer Youth Orientation at EPD Water Treatment Plant conference room, for 29 summer youth who applied to work during their summer break.

The orientation began with a training session held by Katrina Hayes-Wood, who shared information on career goals and workplace etiquette.

She had us walk around the room in groups, to different tables that were set up.

Each table was different from the other, such as one table was about our values, the second was about what jobs seem interesting, the third table focused on what we like to do on our free time, the fourth table provided words we can use to describe us, and

the fifth table showed what are we good at for a job

We had to write it down our thoughts on a sticky note, and stick it on a big paper.

She then had us review it and told us that this is what will help us decide what we want to do when we grow up, based on the things we wrote down on our paper.

# CERT Training for Ak-Chin Community

June 12-14, close to 30 department staff and members from the Ak-Chin Community received Basic Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training.

Manuel Garcia, Ak-Chin Police Chief spearheaded the training that was sponsored by Pinal County Office of Emergency Management and coordinated through the Arizona Department of Emergency and Military affairs. Primary instructors were Tim Gercke, Mike Scherm and Embe Kugler.

CERT training sessions were held for two and a half days at Ak-Chin Circle Elements Event Center.

Topics included;

disaster preparedness, fire safety and utility controls, disaster medical operations, light search and rescue operations, CERT organization, disaster psychology, terrorism and CERT, disaster simulation.

Everyone who attended received a CERT training manual that included informative instruction and scenarios. There were many hands-on activities as well to reiterate what was learned in the manual. The classroom instruction and hands-on training was extremely informative and the instructors did a great job teaching the course.

Some of the hands-on training included how to search and rescue victims in a disaster, the





#### Ak-Chin Language Summer Program

On Wednesday, June 5th, we visited the Ak-Chin Language department to check out their summer language program.

On this day they sang a song and they were making a craft called Kaskalo:n.

The kaskalo:n are easy to make, it just takes newspaper, glue, confetti eggs, and tissue paper.

Kaskalo:n is a confetti egg that people make to ask someone to dance when they're too nervous to ask. So, they tap the person they want to dance with on the head with their kaskalo:n and all the confetti comes out, then they have to dance with them.

As the kids made their kaskalo:n they talk about why they make them. They make them because it's a part of our tradition and because of the upcoming San Juan celebration that's held in the month of June.

So, now you guys at home can make your own kaskalo:n and go to the San Juan celebration and tap it on someone's head that you want to dance with, but are too nervous to ask them.

On our second visit we saw the summer school students learning about health with the Ak-Chin Health Education program.

Health Education was talking about the body muscles and how they work. They also explained how it's very important to stretch before and after anything active like sports.

Before we got to the Language department, they made something called fruit nachos. At the end of Health Education's visit, they played a game with the kids.





proper way to use and extinguish fires with a fire extinguisher, setting up medical treatment areas, establishing triage principals and treatment strategies for threatening conditions.

The final day of training included an active shooter scenario in one of the movie theatres. Afterwards, everyone was treated to lunch and received a certificate for completion.

"CERT training is a FEMA approved program to teach a person how to take care of themselves, their family and their community in a crisis or disaster situation." Instructor Tim Gercke shared.

"CERT is a set of skills that can be taught to anybody in their community, in order to be helpful, take care of themselves and assist first responders in emergency situations."

Tim also shard that the training is meant to keep things simple and to remind people "that it's for their community" and that "they're not taking the place of first responders, but in the event of a community need, people who have basic skills and training can be of more support to the first responders and their community then people that don't have the training. Anybody can take the training, no one is excluded from the training, and there is a role for everybody."

He is hopeful that Chief Garcia will move the program forward, and that others will be interested to take the training once they see the pictures and story.

Chief Garcia shared, "The greatest benefit is we now have 28 employees completed CERT training and have a better understanding of the potential threats to their home, workplace, and our Community. A majority who attended are members or residents of the Community."

Garcia also shared that although the community is in the early stages of development, the future goal "is to have members of this recent class successfully complete CERT Train-the-Trainer become instructors for the CERT Basic Training course."

Garcia added, "Our fire department is currently available to provide the same 20 hours of instruction over a period of several weeks. Plans are

to offer another three-day 20-hour CERT training within the Community during the fall of this year. In addition, we plan to coordinate a Teen CERT training by the fall of this year. We would like to encourage the Community to take advantage of the future CERT training opportunities."

Tim explained that the training is free and there is no judgement, criticism or evaluation. It is an opportunity to learn basic skills that can be helpful to you, be helpful to taking care of your family and add value into your community.


"The important thing is that any contribution to be helpful is good and the primary purpose and focus of CERT is personal safety. We're not there to risk ourselves, we're there to be supportive and take care of ourselves. The CERT focus from FEMA is to do the most good for the most amount of people in a safe way." Tim ended.
