On Saturday, November Ak-Chin 16th, the Indian Community held their tribal elections for Chairman and Vice-Chairman, as well as a special election for one vacant council seat.

With a total of 452 voters, this election had one of the highest number of voters to date. The polls opened at 6am and closed at 2 pm, located in the Ak-Chin Recreation facility.

Once everyone cast their votes, they were invited to the newly renovated community feast house for a BBQ lunch, catered by Vekol, provided by the Ak-Chin Election Board. Members also enjoyed entertainment by Molina's Music, while waiting for the results.

As the music ended and the votes were tallied. everyone awaited the winning results, which were announced by Election Board Member,

Shannon Narcia. With a total of 190 votes, Gabriel Lopez became newly elected Chairman and Delia Carlyle was named Vice-Chairman with a total of 177 votes. Winning the special election was Dennis Antone with a total of 180 votes.

Current Chairman, Robert Miguel shared his thoughts on the election results.

HOME INSPECTIONS

Hello Ak-Chin members and residents, starting January 2025, The Housing Department will resume all home inspections. You will receive a letter (7) seven days before your inspection day.

The most common reasons for failed inspections are dusty air filters and covers, dust accumulation on bathroom fan covers and ceiling fans, missing or burned- out light bulbs, missing light covers, smoke detectors missing batteries or NO smoke detector, not sweeping & mopping the home and yards/patios/carports not in compliance (inoperable vehicles, car parts, tires, appliances and storage of excessive household items, etc. is not allowed) and yards must be free of all trash & weeds.

To all Elders, air filters, light bulbs and batteries for smoke detectors can be replaced for you anytime, just call Housing and a work order will be sent to Maintenance.

Also, if you notice a water leak inside or outside

of your home call it in ASAP so that it can be

repaired. The longer you wait, the more water damage there will be... and water damage causes mold! And you will be responsible for payment of

One last thing, you may or may not know this but maintenance is NOT allowed to fix/repair washers & dryers or any other appliance that the tenant has purchased themselves.
