Since 2018, the Ak-Chin Fire Department has been invited and has attended the school's ceremonies. Paying tribute to their fallen brothers and sisters from that day, Ak-Chin Fire Department Staff members provided the students with gifts of pencils and rulers.

Literally, not too long after we were shut down due to the COVID pandemic, on May 1, 2020, the Ak-Chin Indian Community Library received an Arizona State Library Service Technology Act (LSTA) grant.

The grant was for the amount of \$9,400 to purchase 34 StoryWalk® Signs to be installed on the walking paths at Milton "Paul" Antone Memorial Park & Hohokam Park.

The goal of the Story Stroll is to promote physical activity and find creative methods for enriching literacy enjoyment for all ages.

The intent of Story Stroll in the

parks is to create Library and non-Library related programs: Preschool Storytime and evening Family Storytime.

In November (Native American Heritage Month) the Ak-Chin Language Department will be translating a children's book in O'odham. Other departments are welcome to utilize the signs for promoting one of their events.

The signs will allow ACIC departments the ability to offer social distancing programs throughout the year!

"We are very excited to have the Story Stroll signs in the parks!" Melanie Toledo, Ak-Chin Library Manager.

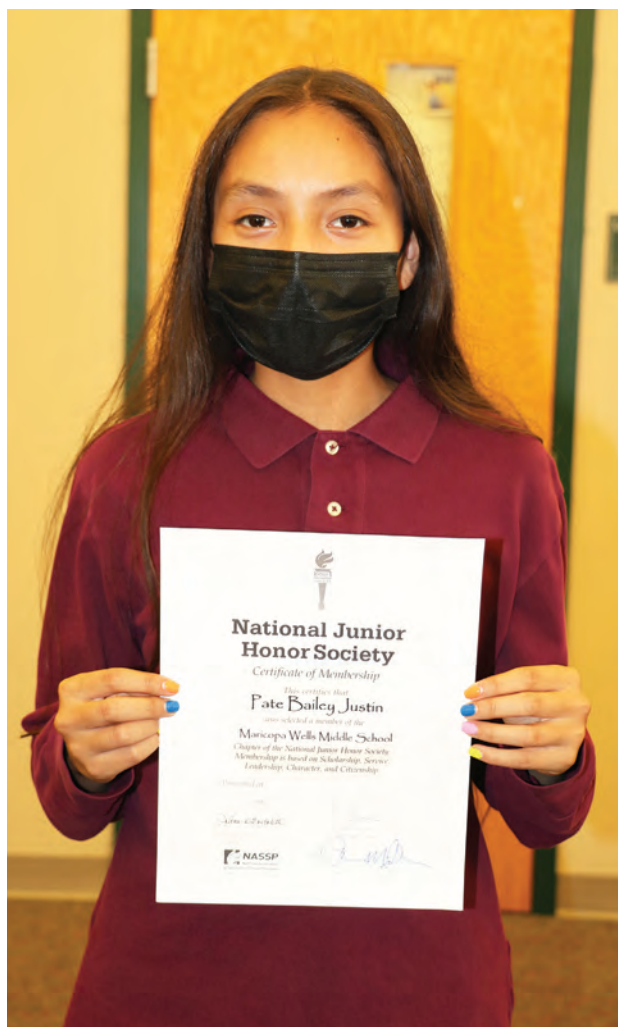

## Military Burial Honors Request Process Updated at Arizona National Cemeteries

On October 1, 2021, the National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona and Prescott National Cemetery will allow family members, friends, and funeral homes to directly coordinate military funeral services for their loved ones with local honor teams.

“Every Veteran with honorable service has earned the right to be interred in a national cemetery and has paid the price with their service to this great nation,” said Randy L. Heard, National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona and Prescott National Cemetery director. “Military burial honors provided by honor teams assure our nation’s Veterans receive a fitting tribute. These honors will continue to be provided at no expense to the families of Veterans; but now, the cumbersome middleman is removed.”

In 1979, the Department of Defense issued a directive establishing categories for burial honors. Active duty and Medal of Honor recipients would receive full military burial honors, while military retirees and other Veterans would receive full military burial honors but only if resources were available. Otherwise, these Veterans would only be entitled to two flag folders.

In the late 1980s, military cutbacks resulted in volunteers stepping up to perform military burial honors. At the National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona, these groups included American Legion Posts #29, #27, #41, and #94; MIA KIA POW Post; and VFW Post #6310; and American Legion Post #6 at the Prescott National Cemetery.

Burial in a VA national cemetery is open to all members of the armed forces and Veterans who have met minimum active duty service requirements, as applicable by law and were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable. Members of the reserve components of the armed forces who die while on active duty under certain circumstances or who die while on training duty are also eligible for burial, as are service members and former service members who were eligible for retired pay at the time of their death. Spouses, minor children and, under certain conditions, dependent unmarried adult children are also eligible for burial even if they predecease the Veteran.

## First Things First serves as a ready resource for parents of babies, toddlers and preschoolers

AK-CHIN (September 2, 2021) – Babies don't come with instruction manuals. That's why First Things First, Arizona's early childhood agency, works to help families of young children feel confident in their role as their child's first and best teacher.

From birth to age 5, a child's brain grows more than any other time in their life. And the early years are the best opportunity to develop the brain connections they need to be healthy, capable, successful adults. That's why FirstThingsFirst.org has tons of resources for raising babies, toddlers and preschoolers. Everything from tips on how to support tummy time for infants to learning how every day back-and-forth interactions help to build early literacy skills.

One of the most unique things about First Things First is that they fund early childhood programs that are locally focused to ensure that families in communities such as Ak-Chin are getting the services that local parents need most. In the FTF Pinal Region, this includes supports such as home visitation programs through Child and Family Resources, parenting education programs, such as the Fun Van through Apache Junction Library and Strengthening Families through U of A Cooperative Extension and the Quality First program, which helps families have access to quality child care and preschool programs.

Children with access to quality early learning environments, whether at home or in an early childhood program,



are more prepared for kindergarten and do better in school. Research shows that when babies, toddlers and preschoolers have caregivers that are engaged in their development, the better they'll do in the long run. Not only academically, but in their relationships with their classmates.

Visit FirstThingsFirst.org to find out about the free programs offered in your area, to read about families being helped in your community or for ways to get

involved. Whether you have a child age 5 and younger in your life or not – investing time, energy and resources in

helping kids arrive at kindergarten prepared to be successful is not only right, it's smart.

#### Zoning Ordinance: Chapter 11 Provisions for Amending the Zoning Ordinance

The Ak-Chin Planning and Development Department (Planning) is in receipt of a Zoning Amendment Application to amend the Ak-Chin Indian Community Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Map pursuant to Chapter 11 of the Community’s Zoning Ordinance.

- The Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map are legal documents that regulates and define land uses on specific properties within the Community’s boundaries. A Zoning Ordinance establishes the process for reviewing development proposals and criteria of development. A Zoning Map depicts the boundaries of the various Zones within the Community’s boundaries.
- The Community’s Zoning Ordinance was last updated in 2007 and the proposed amendments will assist the Community to review future land uses and development proposals.

# StrongHearts Native Helpline Releases One Year Sexual Violence Advocacy Report

While Native Americans and Alaska Natives experience the highest rates of domestic and sexual violence in America, the disparity in services and available resources has not only contributed to the continued perpetuation of violence, it has hindered the healing process needed to recover.

A tool of colonization and subjugation, sexual violence continues to impact Indigenous peoples today. Within four years of operation, StrongHearts Native Helpline identified sexual violence support as an unmet need and took action. In August 2020, StrongHearts advocates completed specialized training and StrongHearts added sexual violence advocacy to their list of services.

"Sexual violence has plagued Native communities for centuries and a disparity of services and resources renders the victim invisible," said Lori Jump (Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians), director, StrongHearts Native Helpline. "In order to assist our relatives on their healing journey, we must address violence on every level." Sexual violence is an umbrella term that refers to any sexual contact without the consent of all parties.

One year after launching sexual violence advocacy, StrongHearts is releasing the data it has collected about this issue among our contacts. Out of all Native American victim-survivors who sought help for sexual violence, 90 percent identified as female. The report also charted the following age demographics and areas of need.

Of all Native American and Alaska Native contacts who experienced sexual violence:

- 35 percent were 25 to 36 years of age.
- 32 percent were 37 to 48 years of age.
- 19 percent were 13 to 24 years of age.
- 15 percent were 49 to 60+ years of age.

The top three needs of Native American and Alaska Native sexual violence victim survivors are listed in order of prevalence:

- 64 percent needed peer support.
- 33 percent needed legal advocacy.
- 28 percent needed shelter.

Based on the data collected, sexual violence survivors who reached out to StrongHearts are mostly females between the ages of 25 to 48 who have been hurt by their intimate partner and are seeking peer support.

"The information gleaned from these numbers will be used to further develop advocate training and to gear it toward meeting the needs of victim-survivors of domestic and sexual violence," concluded Jump. "Native peoples have been underserved with little to no access to resources. We intend to bridge the gap between victim services and those who need them."

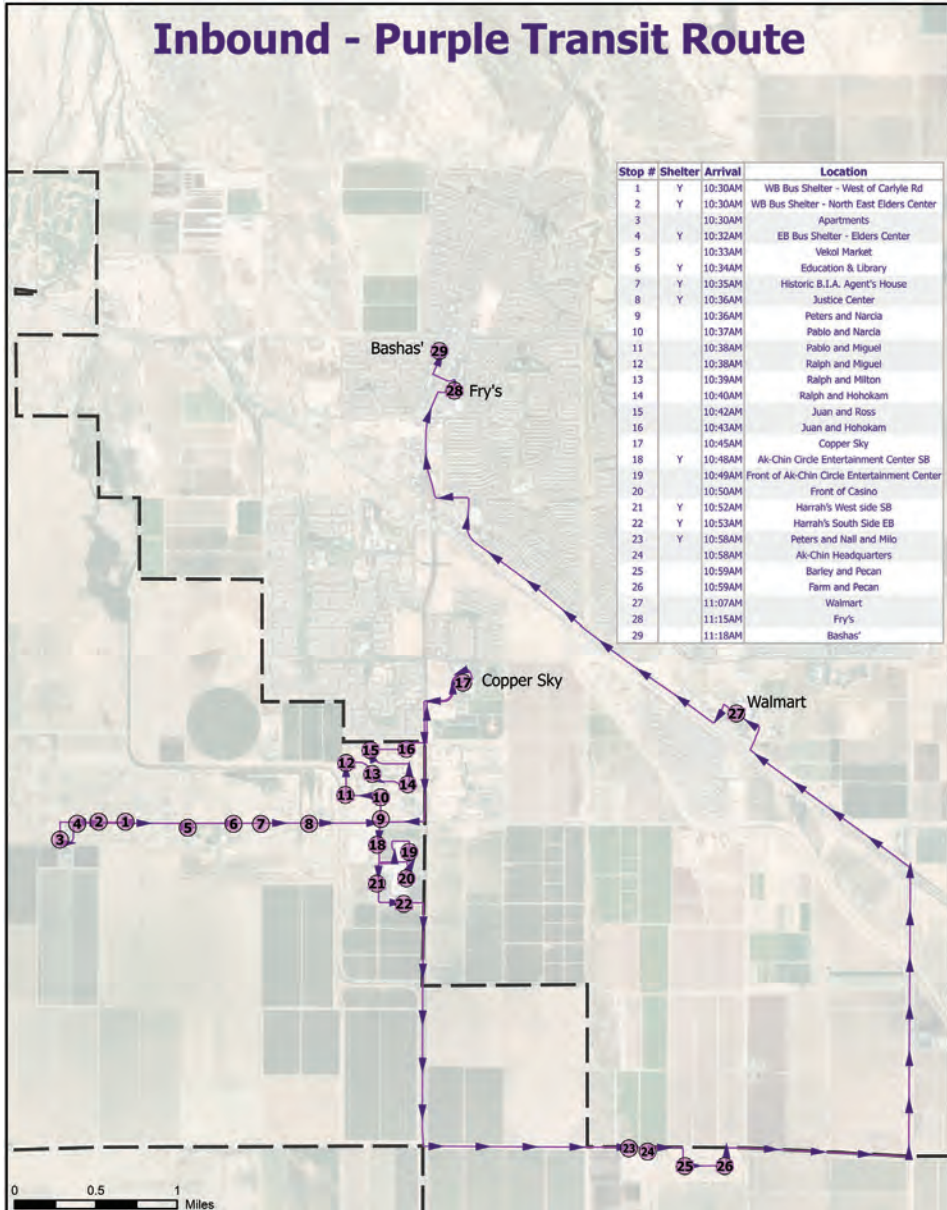


